

<u>Curriculum Overview</u>

During the term the following curriculum areas will be covered:

Biome in a Box

In geography, the children will investigate a range of different biomes. In computing, the children will explore outcomes when giving sequenced instructions.

Once Upon a Poem

The children will explore narrative poems using a range of well-known examples eg Roald Dahl's Revolting Rhymes. The children will learn one by heart and perform it in front of an audience. In Art, the children will create scenery for their performance.

Great Britain, Great Britans

The children will find out about well-known and influential Britons in the world of art, design and craft. In computing, using a range of digital literacy skills, the children will research at least one artist/designer and compile a biography about them, recording this digitally. In art, they will also try to emulate the work of their chosen artist/designer using the appropriate media.

A Child of our Time

In History, children carry out a local history study through the lens of childhood.

Additional Information

PE

The children will have two hours of PE lesson on a Monday afternoon with Mrs Lees and Miss Adams. They need to come to school wearing their school PE Kit. Long hair needs to be tied back and earrings need to be removed.

Forest School
