

Inclusive and really make an effort to communicate and engage with parents. Supportive of working parents.



Whilst it is good to celebrate all that we are doing well here at All Saints, we recognise that in order to further improve we need to act on those areas that you feel we are performing less well in. There were two common themes to your suggestions and I have outlined below how we will address them moving forward. If you have made suggestions that do not fit into these common themes and would like to discuss these suggestions further, please do let me know but rest assured that we have taken them on board and will work towards addressing them throughout the year.

Post-Covid

One common theme amongst the areas to address in the next 12 months was getting back to 'normal' activities following on from covid restrictions. We are very aware of how important this is for the children, staff and parents and are keen to return to our usual diary of events. There are currently two main factors hindering our ability to get back to holding our usual parent participation events. Firstly, the local outbreak team are recommending that bubbles stay in place whilst covid is in school. Unfortunately, we have had 3 outbreaks since October that have meant this has not yet been possible. However, the most frustrating issue currently is the lack of ventilation in our school hall. The room has just 1 small opening window. Following receipt of the Co2 monitors from the DFE we have been monitoring levels and have found that if we have more than 20 children and adults in the room the Co2 levels are well above recommendations. As you will appreciate, this makes it impossible for us to hold any events in the hall. I am currently in negotiations with the local authority to ascertain if funding can be sought to cover the cost of replacing our current windows.

However, we are hopeful that with spring just around the corner we will soon be able to hold more open-air events. One of the first of course will be the celebration of the Queen's jubilee and we look forward to the return of sports day in May.

Expectations and Parent Information

It has been clear from your responses to the questionnaire that we need to improve how we communicate with you regarding your child's progress and attainment. During parent evening discussions we have always endeavoured to give you a clear picture of how well your child is doing, have told you what their targets are for the coming term and have communicated in writing at the end of each year what your child's achievements are in terms of national expectations. Moving forward we will ensure at each parent appointment we also explicitly inform you if your child is currently on track to meet end of year expectations, what the focus will be in the following term and highlight anything additional that you can support your child with at home.

Parent information regarding the curriculum and what will be taught each term is produced at the start of each term. This is usually communicated to you via a sticker in the home school diary. If you have not yet accessed this term's parent information, it can be found on the following links:
