Make a treasure island map with symbols for places on your island. Write a set of clues to where the treasure is buried !



Maybe you could stain it with tea to make it look old?

Make a map of your journey to school showing the buildings and landmarks that you pass along the way.

Maybe you could use symbols of your own and make a key for your map to explain what they are?



Go on a walk around Standon and make a map afterwards to show where you went and what you saw.

Or

Draw a sketch of the best view on the walk.



Find out what symbols are used on an Ordnance Survey map and make a key to show us your 15 favourites!



Keep a weather diary for Standon for a week or even longer! Make a note of the temperature, the amount of rainfall each day and create a symbol to show what the weather was like on that day.



Draw a map of your garden as a bird's eye view. Colour it in and label the things in your garden.



Have a mini-beast hunt in 3 different places in your garden. Create a results table to show how many of each mini-beast you found in each place.

Explain: Which was the best place and why?
