Children should also read to an adult daily and complete their maths and phonics home learning.

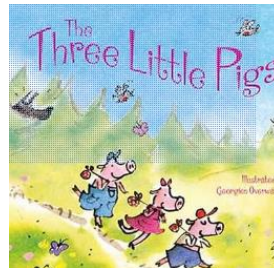

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Write your own short version of a traditional story. You can choose which story you write. You might want to choose something like 'The Gingerbread Man' or 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff'.

Make your own home from somewhere around the world. Try to make it strong and stable. You can choose which materials you use to make it.



Draw your own simple map showing the area where you live. Try to include different symbols.



Create your own rural or urban artwork. You can choose what you use to create it e.g. collage materials, pastels, paint etc. Think about what you should include in your rural (countryside) or urban (town or city) picture.



Read a traditional story and then retell it to someone else. Remember to use story language when you do it.
