I have set some practical tasks below, should you wish to complete them. Activities link to the learning we are doing in class.

The activities are set every Tuesday.

The Very Hungry Caterpillar— 29th April

Can you complete the repeating patterns on the caterpillar sheets given to you? Can you create your own repeating pattern-pillar on the back? Maybe it has more than 2 colours in it?

From Caterpillar to Butterfly — 6th May

Write a simple fact sheet, containing at least 3 facts, about a butterfly (or its Lifecycle)

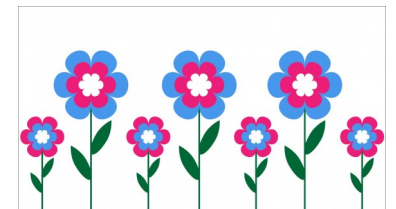
Remember to include some illustrations.

What the Ladybird Heard — 13th May

Can you create a ladybird from collage, play dough, clay or paint? Can you show that the number of spots on its wings are a double?

Flower Power — 20th May

Mrs Griffin will send some Maths work home, counting the different flowers you can see. Can you record how many of the different flowers there are in a grid, like we use in class, then talk or write about which group is the largest, or has the fewest



flowers.

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Collins Hub Phonics reading books

Our home reading books link closely to the Little Wandle Phonics scheme we follow in school. Each child will read a shared book 3 times in school, with sessions focussed on word reading, prosody and comprehension. Their weekly book will then be shared with you at home. Some children will also have an additional home reading 'school book'. Please read this **at least** 3 times.

All books should be read regularly at home so children build up fluency, and understanding of the text. Children should be able to sight read at least 80% of the book before they move onto the next which means practice makes perfect!

When doing any reading at home, please date, sign or initial every time they have read at home.

Phonics

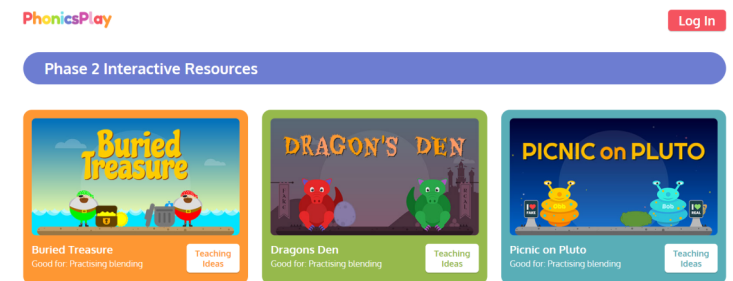
The Phonics Play website is where you will find some free games to practice reading words containing sounds we have learnt. Your Home-School diaries will tell you which sounds to look at, linking to the new sounds we have looked at each week. The three free games are 'Buried Treasure', 'Dragon's den' and 'Picnic on Pluto'.

After you have selected one of the three games shown here, select Phase 2 or Phase 3 and filter the selection to show words using phonemes, digraphs and trigraphs we know or need to practice. Children then have to decide if they are real or nonsense words and put them in the correct place.

Maths

Mathletics is available to complete activities and gain certificates in celebration Assembly. Look for your log-in at the back of your reading diary.

Some activities linked to the Maths learning we have been doing may be assigned for you to complete, but you can log in whenever you like and access the games to earn points. When you have received particular points totals you will receive certificates in Celebration Worship!
