RE	Why is the word God so important to Christians? A Wet and Windy Harvest for Puddles RE Focus: Develop an awareness and enjoyment of church activities and the Christian Harvest festival. Why are we special? What makes us special? Why is God special? Why is Jesus special?	Why are some stories special? The Baby Birds RE Focus: The wider world, other beliefs. Identify symbolic actions, gestures Core Learning: The Bible is a very special book and we can read stories about God and Jesus in it. Compare this to the stories in the Qur'an. Puddles and the Happy Easter Day RE Focus: Easter celebrations: Remembering Jesus the teacher; sad times and happy times. Story of Easter. Learning about the cross as a symbol for Christianity. Singing songs to celebrate Easter.	What makes every person special, unique and important? Puddles Lends a Paw RE Focus: Helping others: Develop an awareness of a variety of ways in which people might help in a church and of the Christian teaching to help others. Core Learning: That Christians believe that every person is created by God in His image. That God wants a relationship with the people He created. That Christians try to help one another as everyone is important. As we are all special we need to respect other people as valued and important.
