A gentle reminder to ensure all water bottles and uniform, including PE kits and forest school wear are named please, so they can be returned to the correct child if they go missing.















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
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Spotlight on... Collective Worship

This half term our Collective Worship theme has been 'Generosity'. We have explored ideas around service and giving through drama, prayer and song.

These worships have been supported by the Bible passage 2 Corinthians 9.7: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." This calls us to think about our reasons and choices when we give. The phrase "God loves a cheerful giver" underscores the joy and willingness that should accompany our generosity.

We have linked the theme of generosity to Harvest time, and the reasons why we give food to others today. We were fortunate to have Kerry, a volunteer from the food bank visit us in Worship last week and speak to the children about the current need for food banks and why they are important to our community.



What's been happening in... Cherry Class


Children in Cherry Class are really excited to be taking part in
